

Carla García Zendejas - Environmental Attorney

Carla García Zendejas is a Director of the Border Power Plant Working Group. A graduate of the Universidad Autonoma de Baja California Law School she earned a masters in International Law at the Washington College of Law at American University as a Fulbright Scholar. She participated in forums with community and government representatives in drafting the Municipal Environmental Code for the City of Tijuana. She also worked with state grassroots environmental organizations participating directly with the Baja California State Congress to draft State Environmental Law reform, which incorporates fundamental issues of public participation and right to know legislation.

Carla has participated as Mexican partner with the E-LAW network (Environmental Law Alliance Worldwide) sharing legal strategies across borders since 1998. She is now participating directly in outreach and capacity building with Latin America.

Attorney Carla Garcia Zendejas is based in Tijuana, Baja California where she also works independently with U.S. and Mexican NGO's on cross border issues such as water within the Ja Jan Binational Coastal Monitoring Group, as well as sustainable power plants and environmental justice issues.
